

Hamilton Crew Training Centre

Officially opened in April 2005, CTC's Crew Training Centre at Hamilton International Airport provides training facilities and accommodation for up to 144 trainee pilots.

The centre is based on a prime, 2.8 hectare site adjacent to the airport's main runway. The 19,000 square foot, purpose-built training centre includes ten briefing rooms, four lecture rooms, a crew room, two simulator cells, planning and operations facilities and administration offices.

Since opening in 2005, CTC has grown rapidly to become a major force in the New Zealand aviation industry and is also part of the Waikato Aviation Cluster. The company projects that through employment and use of New Zealand services, it will inject approximately \$95 million into the economy over the next ten years.



CTC Wings Commercial Pilot Programme

CTC is renowned for training the best pilots in the international aviation industry who fly with the world's top airlines. CTC's programmes are differentiated from other pilot training programmes, being airline focused in content and syllabus.

In November 2006, CTC announced the launch of its CTC Wings Commercial Pilot Programme, conducting flight training for students enrolled in the Nelson Marlborough Institute of Technology's (NMIT) aviation programme diploma.

Through the CTC Wings Commercial Pilot Programme, the company helps trainees access TEC approved student loan financing to cover training costs. The programme is one of the most comprehensive in New Zealand - training is completed in 18 months when students gain a Diploma of Aviation Science from NMIT.

Finally, CTC has a strong employment focus and works with trainees to help them find a job upon graduation.



CTC Wings Sponsored Instructor Programme

CTC also runs an 18 week CTC Wings Sponsored Instructor Programme. Pilots with a Commercial Pilots License and Instrument Rating are trained to become 'C' Category Flying Instructors.

Successful trainee instructors are engaged by CTC as salaried employees and enrolled on a professional development programme leading towards the top 'A' Category Instructor Rating.



Clearways Cadet Accommodation

In November 2006, CTC officially opened its trainee accommodation complex, Clearways. The facility comprises four buildings, each containing 24 studio rooms, central kitchens, laundries, storage and lounge areas. Onsite is a gym and other sporting and leisure facilities.

A 'green transport plan' was part of the development's design, and CTC has a distinctive liveried fleet of mini-buses to minimise the number of journeys between Clearways and the Training Centre.



CTC Training Fleet

CTC has a fleet of 22 aircraft based at its Training Centre with more on order. The fleet includes twin engine aircraft (Diamond DA42 TwinStars and Piper PA44 Seminoles), and single engine aircraft (Diamond DA20 Katanas, Robin 2160s and Cessna 172s).

New Zealand-built Alpha 160A trainers and further Diamond TwinStars are on order and will replace and expand the Company's aircraft fleet. On-site aircraft maintenance facilities within CTC's purpose built hangar support the fleet.
